Oregon's Fair Pay Law

Patricia "Trish" Garner, the AAUW of OR State Public Policy Chair who led the coalition to advocate for passage of the Pay Equity Bill, will be our speaker. She will tell us about the legislative process required to get the bill passed and highlight its features. Oregon's Equal Pay Act was signed into law on October 6, 2017. Shilpi Banerjee, Public Policy Vice-Chair, will describe the AAUW Fair Pay Toolkit they authored to publicize the requirements of the law.

The new law cannot help women unless they know their rights. Our program will answer questions for employers and employees. What does Oregon's Pay Equity Act really mean for Oregonians? What does pay equity mean? What about seniority or merit? What can you do if you believe you are not being paid fairly? Can you talk about your salary or wages with fellow employees? We will be discussing these and other issues.

Trish was a federal prosecutor and a criminal In Oregon, she obtained a defense attorney. master's degree in social work from Portland State and has training in conflict resolution and mediation. She is a member of Portland and Astoria branches.

Shilpi is an audiologist, researcher and educator. She is a member of Hillsboro-Forest Grove and Portland branches.

For our October meeting, Tigard Area Branch AAUW will be joining other groups for an engaging presentation and lively discussion about initiatives that will appear on Oregonian's ballots in November. This event is being co-sponsored by Lake Oswego Branch of AAUW and League of Women Voters (LWV).

Issues on the ballot this year are:

- Measure 103 (to ban taxing groceries)
- Measure 104 (defines revenue for the 3/5th vote requirement)
- Measure 105 (to repeal Oregon's Sanctuary
- Measure 106 (to prohibit public funding for abortion)

- Turn right at Country Club Road.

Take Action to Oppose Judge Kavanaugh's Confirmation to the Supreme Court

Last month, President Trump nominated Judge Brett Kavanaugh to a lifetime appointment on the U.S. Supreme Court. The stakes are very high.

AAUW has carefully considered Judge Kavanaugh's record and one thing is clear: he would put at risk the issues that are central to AAUW's mission such as: upending employment and labor rights, opposing reproduction rights and access to contraception, seeking to delay a woman's right to an abortion, entangling public education and religion, and restricting voting rights. Here's what you can do and say.

Message example: Judge Kavanaugh's record makes it clear that he won't support women's constitutional and civil rights. I urge you to oppose his confirmation and call for his full record to be released to the American public.
