Courtney Neron is State Representative of House District 26, which includes Wilsonville, King City, Sherwood, South Hillsboro, half of Scholls, and parts of Aloha, Beaverton, Newberg, Tigard, and Tualatin. It will be interesting to hear her discuss what it has been like to run a campaign for reelection. She will tell us about the challenges and triumphs of her first term in office.

Much of the work in the legislature is done in committees, and Courtney keeps very busy since she serves on the House Education Committee, House Veterans & Emergency Preparedness Committee, and the Joint Committee on Ways & Means Subcommittee on Natural Resources.

She also works on local issues including the Sherwood Pedestrian Bridge, the I-5 Boone Bridge, and access to childcare, and much more.

As an educator and mother, she cares deeply about the importance of a strong public education, affordable housing, accessible health care, and environmental stewardship. For nearly a decade she taught French and Spanish in Yamhill-Carlton, Tualatin, and Tigard High Schools, resigning to run for the State Legislature in 2018.

Courtney grew up in Tigard and has been involved in service clubs, athletics, student government, political organizations, theater, and parent groups. She says that community involvement and communication have always been an important part of her life. Tigard Area Branch is now pleased that she joined our branch this year.

AAUW Fund: The Gift that Keeps on Giving

Years ago, Tigard Area Branch established and completed funding—endowing—an AAUW Career Development Grant. An endowment is a donation of money or property to a nonprofit organization, which uses the resulting investment income for a specific purpose. Most endowments are designed to keep the principal amount intact while using the investment income for charitable efforts.

AAUW Career Development Grants provide funding to women who hold a bachelor's degree and are preparing to advance or change careers or re-enter the workforce in education, health,

and medical sciences, or social sciences. Primary consideration is given to women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in nontraditional fields.



Every year the interest from fund #1795 Tigard (OR) Branch helps support a deserving woman post-graduate student. This year, our endowment is helping finance Debbie Padilla at Washington State University, Pullman. Debbie's field is biology and she is working toward a P.S.M. (Professional Science Masters) in Molecular Biosciences. She wants to reduce the educational barriers faced by underserved communities pursuing degrees in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Debbie Padilla is only one of the exceptional recipients selected to pursue academic work and lead innovative community projects to empower women and girls.
